DEATH OF MR J M GINNANE.

We regret to record the death of an old and very popular citizen, Mr James M. Ginnane, who passed away on Thursday evening in the 70th year of his age. He had been in failing health for some time past. His death will be heard of with sorrow by hosts of friends in Limerick and Clare. He was a native of Kildysart, and belonged to an old and very highly esteemed family. For very many years he was associated with commercial life in Limerick, and for a large portion of that period was manager of the "Limerick Leader." He gave two sons to journalism. Deep sympathy is expressed with his widow and family in their bereavement.

The remains were interred this morning in Mount St Lawrence Cemetery. Requiem Mass was celebrated this morning for the dead in St Michael's Parochial Church. The cortege was of large proportions.
