Three More Deaths

During an attack on a military party at Newcomen Bridge, North Strand, on Saturday evening, J Hanratty (12), Moy Elta-road, was mortally wounded, and ten persons, including two D.M.P constables, were wounded.

During shooting in Little Mary-street at 10.25 p.m on Saturday, H. O'Rourke, a labourer, of Cornmarket, was shot dead, and two persons were wounded.

J. Millar, who was wounded in an ambush in St Stephen's Green on the 29th ult, has died.

Yesterday afternoon, at 3 o'clock, the remains of the late Mrs Anna Colivet were removed from St Munchin's Catholic Church for interment in Meunt St Laurence Cemetery. The funeral yesterday was large and representative. It was a striking tribute of respect to the memory of the deceased and of sympathy with her husband, Mr M P Colivet, M. 
