NORTHERN TROOP TRAIN DERAILED.

Three Soldiers and a Guard Killed.

A Belfast message states that a train which was conveying the 10th Hussars and their horses from Belfast to Dublin was yesterday wrecked by a bomb explosion at Aravoyle, in the Co. Armagh. The train was moving at a fair speed, when the engine jumped an obstruction, and so did the leading carriage, but there was then an explosion, with the result that several carriages were derailed, three soldiers and the guard of the train were killed, and two soldiers and the assistant guard were wounded. Some thirty horses were either killed or so injured that they had to be destroyed. An investigation showed that a section of the rails had been taken up and bombs placed in the gaps.
