FUNERAL OF LIEUT WARREN, M.C.

Yesterday the remains of the late Lieutenant Warren, M.C., of the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry, who died as a result of wounds received in an ambuscade at Tulla, on Monday, were removed from the New Barracks for the railway station, en route for Oxford, where the interment is to take place. The funeral left the barracks at 2 o'clock, and travelled to the station by way of Glentworth-street. All along the line of route due respect was shown for the dead by those who congregated in the street. The coffin, borne on a gun carriage, was covered by the Union Jack, upon which rested the sword and cap of the deceased officer. There was a large attendance of military and police in the cortège, and many beautiful floral tributes were carried by members of the dead officer's battalion. Col.-Commandant Cameron walked at the rear of the funeral with other officers of the garrison, and the clergy present were the Dean of Limerick and Rev A E Hewetson. The music appropriate to the sad occasion was played by the bands of the Oxford and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry and of the Royal Welch Fusiliers. On arriving at the station the coffin was placed in a mortuary carriage attached to the 2.45 p.m. train for Kingstown. Before the train departed the Last Post was sounded, and the troops having re-formed, returned to quarters.
