You published a few years ago a list of the names, but alas few now remain. The younger members of these Co Care families invariably joined the army or navy, and two of the Forthfergus clan were at Waterloo, and one the Adjutant of the 9th, was killed at San Sebastian. In the faminelyears of 1847 8 members of the family preserved the lives of all who lived in Coolteenagowan, and I have often met with the children or grandchildren of these poor people, who are now prosperous of the United States. Now that from King to poorest subject we are all praying for peace and quietness, I am glad, after a long life in the land nigh Shannon, to add my testimony as to the happy relations which existed at Fortfergue, Corofiel, and Coolternagowan between every class and creed.
