### FORESTRY IN IRELAND.

The first annual report of the Forestry Commissioners states that up to September 39th last £69,091 was spent directly on forestry operations. of which £2,381 was spent in Ireland; 48,342 acres of land were acquired, of which 3,170 were in Ireland (not ire uding 1 and previously acquired by the Department); 1,595 acres were planted, of which 202 were in Ireland. The total expenditure for the year was £12,776, of which £1,351 was spent in Iroland. Irish nurseries cover 21 acres. Of £3,513 spent on nurseries, Ireland's share was £493.
