IRISH PRISONERS.

Parole Countermanded.

Some sensation was created in Dublin last evening, when an order was issued by General Macready, General Officer Commanding in Iraland, countermanding all parole for Irish prisoners until Vr Staines, who escaped from Rath Camp at the Curragh, returns to prison. This order does not, of course, apply to T.D.'s at present in session, who have been released unconditionally. It only affects releases on account of illness, or a death in a family.
