The Bureau of Standards is the manufacturer of the unit of resistance, one of the fundamental units upon which measurement of electrical power is based. Hence the construction of this novel resistance bridge which is capable of making measurements with a degree of accuracy of one part in 100,000 or to one thousandth per cent.

The apparatus can be used as a simple Wheatstone bridge for resistances of one ohm and above or as a double bridge for resistances below one ohm. The bridge is operated in oil, the temperature being automatically kept constant. Apparatus for testing of electrical resistance standards, in order to ensure best results, requires a mechanism of special design and constructed of the choicest material. Consequently, both the resistance bridge and galvanometer were designed and built by the Bureau of Standards for the specific work to which the units have been dedicated.
