FATAL CITY ACCIDENT.

Old Man Killed.

An accident, which terminated fatally, occurred this morning at Mr J. Blake's limestone quarry, Rosbrien, the victim being William Hamilton, 70, living at Prospect Hill. The deceased, who was a widower, was employed as a workman at the quarry, and while engaged in excavating this morning a large quantity of stone and debris fell on him, pinning him underneath. When extricated, life was found to be almost extinct. Meantime he was attended by a priest and doctor. The remains were removed subsequently to the residence of the deceased, pending an inquest.
