GREAT MUNSTER CATTLE AND SHEEP FAIR.

The November Great Munster Cattle and
Sheep Fair, held yesterday, was disappointing
from a seller's point of view. There was a large
number of cattle on offer, but trade was slow with
the tendency of prices downward. Compared
with the October fair quotations were a couple of
pounds below what could be obtained then, with
the result that sellers were unwilling to part with
stock, and very many lots remained unsold. Three
years old bullocks realised from £25 to £30 each;
three years old heifers went at from £20 to £24;
two years old bullocks sold at prices ranging from
£17 to £20; two years old heifers fetched from
£14 to £18; year and a half sold fairly well, the
prices obtained being from £13 to £17. Fat cows,
for which there was practically no demand, were
quoted at prices ranging from £12 to £24, while
sheep realised from 70s to 80s, or about 10d per lb.

DEATH OF MR J LAWLOR

The death took place at his residence, Thomond-
gate, on Wednesday, of Mr Joseph Lawlor. The
deceased was a member of the Amalgamated
Society of Engineers, and for some years past he
had been employed at the Electric Power Station,
Frederick street. By his death his wife and six
children are deprived of their breadwinner, and
great sympathy is felt for them in their bereave-
ment. The funeral took place yesterday at 3
o'clock from St Munchin's Catholic Church for
Mount St Lawrence Cemetery.

RECOVERY OF TRADE.

Cancellation of War Debts.

Sir Adam Nimmo, Vice-President of the Mining
Association, speaking at Swansea, said inter-
national indebtedness, due to the war, was
making trade impracticable. Many minds
formerly opposed to the cancellation of debts were
beginning to think it might be a wise policy. In
the interests of trade and of the population there
must be a return to industrial sanity.

Mr J H Thomas, M.P., speaking at Derby, said
no good purpose would be served by assuming
there was any short cut to a solution of the un-
employment problem or any immediate remedy.
Loss or unprofitable or unaccustomed work were
no solution. He had just returned from Belgium,
where he had met French, Belgian and German
representatives, the last named of whom declared
that his country was heading towards bankruptcy.

That would inevitably land the other two
countries into the same position and England
would next become involved. The first step to
take would be to stabilise the exchange, and the
sooner war debts were cancelled the sooner should
we be on the road to recovery.
