### Claims to Franchise.

Sir Francis E. Hearney, Registration Officer, opened the Revision of the Parliamentary and municipal voters' lists in the County Courthouse this morning. He was occupied for a time in reading over the lists.

The feeling was expressed that as far as the limitation of the regulations permitted, Sir Francis Kesrney met the representations made by the Deputy Mayor, Mr O'Brien and the Town Clerk as fairly as could be expected by giving every facility to people entitled to be on the register,
