NOTICE TO OWNERS OF MECHANICALLY
PROPELLED ROAD VEHICLES.

THE Limerick County Council, in pursuance
of the powers vested in them under the
Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing)
Order, 1921, made under the Roads Act, 1920,
heretofore were owners of Mechanically Propelled
Road Vehicles, which are ordinarily kept within
the County of Limerick, that immediate step
will be taken to enforce payment of all outstand-
ing Licence Duty on same.

Licence Duty can be paid through the post, or
personally, to the undersigned between the hours
of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m., and on Saturdays between
the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m.

In applying for a Declaration Form, on which
application for a Licence must be made, the
applicant should state the kind of vehicle for
which the Licence is required.

Cheques and Postal Orders in payment of
Licence Duty should be made payable to "The
Limerick County Council," and crossed "Licences
A/c Payees."

Owners of Mechanically Propelled Road
Vehicles are also hereby notified that the Licence
Card shall be carried in the approved pattern
holder in the prescribed position on the vehicle
at all times when it is being used on a public
road.


