FUNERAL OF MRS NOLAN.


The funeral of the late Mrs James Nolan,
Ballyanne, Shanagolden, took place on Sunday
last from St John's Cathedral to the family burial
place at Knockpatrick, Shanagolden. The de-
ceased, who passed away in St John's Hospital
on Friday, was a member of a highly respected
family, and was herself a very estimable lady.
Her demise caused deep and widespread regret,
and the keenest sympathy, in which we fully
share, is tendered to the bereaved relatives. High
Mass for the repose of the deceased's soul was
celebrated in the Cathedral on Saturday, and the
funeral said at 10 o'clock on Sunday morning.
The cortège was one of the largest and most re-
presentative seen either in city or county for
many years and was a striking testimony of the
widespread respect and esteem enjoyed by the
deceased and her numerous relatives and con-
nections.
