DEATH OF MR DAVID GILLIGAN.

The death took place on Saturday night at his
 residence, Merchant's Quay, of Mr David Gilligan
 after a somewhat prolonged illness, and in his
 seventieth year. The deceased was for many
 years connected with the pig-buying trade in the
 city, and later was clerk of the Potato Market.
 After the passing of the Local Government Act,
 1898, he was elected Alderman of the Castle Ward,
 and during his term of office frequently acted as
 locum tenens for the then Mayor, the late Alder-
 man John Daly. On the expiry of his term as
 Alderman he did not seek re-election. He was a
 man of kindly and sympathetic views, beloved by
 a wide circle of friends, who mourn his death and
 sympathise with his family in their sorrow. The
 funeral took place from St Mary's Church last
 evening for Mount St Lawrence Cemetery and was
 largely attended.
