ance, remarks "Pepita" in the *Mark Lane Express*, if there is any reason to suspect there are noxious germs on the premises.

During hot weather the cellar, lavatories, and cesspools about the house and barn should be treated to a good disinfectant every week. During the winter months these places require only an occasional disinfecting.

Thorough ventilation of the house in winter is more difficult than in summer-time, especially if there is sickness or a member of the family who is inclined to take cold easily. When thorough ventilation is hindered the house may be kept in a sanitary condition by the use of a disinfectant.

When there is sickness in the house it is a good plan to keep a small dish of carbolic acid solution in one corner of the bedroom for disinfecting purpose. A little of this solution sprinkled in the sleeping rooms, &c., at any time will keep them in a sanitary condition, which is very important.
