## CANADIAN CATTLE DEBATE.

To the motion in favour of the removal of the Canadian cattle embargo, which is to be debated in the House of Commons after Easter, an amendment has been placed on the paper by Mr Ernest Evans, Mr Coote, and Captain Walter Elliot. It asks the House, while taking note of the recommendations of the recent Royal Commission, to declare that it would "be inadvisable to repeal the Diseases of Animals Act, 1896, at the present moment for the following reasons:—That there is a serious depression in the agricultural industry, which has occurred since the Commission reported; that the Commission suggested that some delay might reasonably take place in introducing the changes; and that the Commission stated that the removal of the so-called embargo would not appreciably affect the price of meat."

## FUNERAL OF A VOLUNTEER.

The remains of the late Michael O'Neill, a Volunteer, who was accidentally wounded at the New Barracks on Sunday morning by a rifle bullet, death supervening in Barrington's Hospital on Tuesday, were interred this evening in Mount St Lawrence Cemetery. Overnight the coffin rested in St Munchin's Church, and this evening the funeral took place. There was a large and representative cortege, embracing, as well as members of the general public, I.R.A. forces and Boy Scouts. At the close of the burial service the "Last Post" was sounded, and the usual volleys were fired over the grave by a firing party.

The chief mourners were—Daniel O'Neill, father; Patrick and Thomas O'Neill, brothers; Michael and Patrick O'Rourke, uncles.
