### The Statement of Accounts.

The Cunard Steamship Company's statement of accounts for the year ended December 31st last, shows that after providing for depreciation of ships and other properties and plant, income tax, corporation profits tax, debenture interest and proportion of discount on debenture stock, and including £169,075 brought forward from 1920, there remains at credit of profit and less account £669,105. Dividends, amounting to £135,000, have been paid on the 5 per cent, and 6 per cent, Preference stock. The directors recommend a dividend of 71, payable on and after May let, of 71 per cent on Ordinary shares, including Government share, from which income tax will be dedueted, leaving a balance of £199,889, which is parried forward.


