steamer of 1,400 tons D.W., which is being  
named the "Luimneach," and has the honour of  
being the first vessel registered in Limerick since  
the Irish Board of Trade has passed from the con-  
trol of England. Captain Carlo Haarahan, of  
Limerick, is being appointed to the command of  
this steamer.

This vessel, which is splendidly equipped for  
general cargo trade, is intended to augment those  
engaged on the regular services between South  
and West of Ireland ports and the Continent.  
We learn that the Limerick Steamship  
Company, Ltd., are actively engaged at  
present in developing to a much greater ex-  
tent than formerly direct trading between Ireland  
and the Continent, thereby opening up new  
avenues of trade.
