TOLL OF FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE IN BRITAIN.

During the last cutbreak of foot-and mouth disease there were slaughtered between January 23 aud May 26, Sir A G Bossawen states, 23,125 cattle, 23,908 sheep, 9,395 pigs, and 47 goats.
