SEX DISPROPORTION.

The male population in Europe is estimated to be 25,000,000 below that of the female population in numbers. Last year's census revealed that the excess of females over males in England and Wales amounted to 1,720,802, as compared with 1,179,276 at the previous census. This is the highest preponderance ever recorded. Similar results were revealed by the census of Scotland.

EAST LIMERICK COMHAIRLE CEANNTAIR.

At a largely attended meeting of Limerick Comhairle Ceanntair, which was held at the Hospital on 28th ult., the Chairman, Walsh, presiding, the following resolution was proposed by Mr Thomas Coffey, and seconded by Michael Costello, was unanimously adopted:

"That the East Limerick Comhairle Ceanntair, which is composed of every interest in the city, pledges unqualified support to the national Government and earnestly appeals to all other organisations, Farmers' Union, Transport Union, and the Limerick Union—both in East Limerick and City, to give Sinn Fein a free field in the forthcoming elections, as the establishment of a stable Government is an indispensable necessity in the present."

"As Sinn Fein began the work for Ireland, we respectfully ask the collaboration of all other organisations to perfect it, and this can only be done by the subordinating of all class interests to the present."
