

LARCENY FROM A SHOP.

Exciting Chase.

Two men named Gaharty and Browne were arrested last evening on a charge of stealing money from Miss Galbraith, stationer, and news-agent, Upper Cecil-street. The men entered the shop on some pretext or other, and after the larceny they left, and were pursued by the City Police, who effected their arrest, aided by an army captain, who happened to be in the vicinity at the time. They were formally charged this morning and remanded. The accused are stated to be natives of Dublin.

CREAMERIES STRIKE.

Settlement at Lansdowne Factory.

The strike at the Condensed Milk Company's principal factory, Lansdowne, has been settled. The Factory and the greater number of its auxiliaries have been closed down since the 13th of April owing to the employees, who are members of the Transport Workers' Union, refusing to accept a "cut" in wages, and other conditions. The terms of settlement have not been disclosed. It is not likely that work at Lansdowne and its auxiliaries will be resumed for about a week. The Soviet who have been working Brures factory and its auxiliaries have handed back the property to the Condensed Milk Company.

DEATH OF MR FRANK O'SHEA.

The death occurred at his residence last night of Mr Frank O'Shea, after a brief illness. The deceased was for the past twenty-two years a member of the clerical staff of the Limerick County Council, having been appointed in 1899, after the Act of 1898 coming into force. He was a capable, courteous, and obliging official, and his demise at an early age is keenly regretted by his colleagues and a large circle of friends. He was the sole support of an aged and widowed mother, with whom the utmost sympathy is felt in her bereavement. The remains will be removed to St Michael's Parochial Church this evening, and the funeral will leave at 12 o'clock to-morrow for interment at Askeaton.
