ACCIDENTALLY SHOT DEAD.

Lieut Wm Spillane, on active service with the First Cork Brigade, has been accidentally shot dead by one of his comrades. He was interred at Cork on Sunday with full military honours.

CITY DROWNING FATALITY.

Last evening a distressing drowning fatality took place in the Shannon, opposite the King's Island, when James Ambrose, New Road, Thomondgate, a commission agent, lost his life. About eight o'clock, when the tide was well on the ebb, Mr Ambrose, with another man named Thomas Walsh, also residing in Thomondgate, went to bathe in the river. They had got to about the centre of the stream when they were noticed to be in difficulties, and shouts for help were heard. Some men went to the rescue, and succeeded in taking them ashore. Restoratives were applied, but Ambrose was beyond human aid, and expired after being attended to by the Very Rev Canon O'Driscoll. The remains were subsequently removed to his home. The deceased was a married man, and a native of West Limerick, but had been engaged in business in the city for a number of years.

SUDDEN DEATH.

This morning a foreman of the permanent way in the employment of the Great Southern and Western Railway, suddenly took ill at the locomotive works, and died in a short time. The deceased was aged about sixty-five years and unmarried. The remains were removed to the city morgue, pending an inquest being held.
