### BRITISH TELEPHONE FEES.

The reductions in telephone fees in this country come Into operation on Saturday. The principal concessions are-Installation rental for a connection to a private residence where no business is carried on has been reduced by 30s per annum. making the new quarterly rental 35s in London, 32s 6d in Birmingham, Liverpool, Manchester, Glasgow, and 30s elsewhere. The charge for twoparty lines will be 22: 6d per quarter for a residence connection, and 301 for a business connecpion. The fee for a local cell will be reduced from lad to lld, and the charge for a call over a distance between 5 and 7 miles will be 21d instead of 3d. Extra mileage charge will be lowered from 25s to 20s per furlong. A similar reduction age plies to external extensions and to private telephone wires.
