## LIMERICK IRREGULARS KILLED

### In Newcastle West.

The remains of Edward O'Dwyer and Cornelius  
O'Dwyer, brothers, natives of the city, who were  
killed in the course of military operations at  
Newcastle West while fighting with the irregulars,  
will arrive in the city by motor to-night. They  
will be taken to St John's Cathedral, from where  
the funeral will leave to-morrow for Mount St  
Lawrence Cemetery.

It is stated that another irregular named  
Hogan, a native of Thomondgate, was also  
seriously wounded at Newcastle West.

## Birdhill House Burned.

## Reported Attack on Clarecastle Barracks.

A report reached Limerick to-day that the
