THE CRUISE OF THE SAOIRSE.

A cable was received in Dublin on Monday from Mr S D Lavells, one of the crew of the yacht Saoirse, which left Dublin in June on a cruise round the world, announcing that Mr Conor O'Brien (the captain) had decided to change his route. The Saoirse at present is at Pernambuco, in Brazil, where she is undergoing repairs, and will sail next Monday on the last stage of her outward journey. The original plan was to call at Cape Town, and then to sail direct to Australia, but now Mr O'Brien proposes to miss Cape Town, and to sail direct to New Zealand, making Wellington his first port of call.

SHOOTING IN CORK.

Girl Dead.

A shooting affray occurred in the Backpool district of Cork on Saturday night, as the result of which two girls were seriously wounded, one named Miss Abina Murphy, St James's square, who received a bullet wound in the abdomen, died subsequently.

It is stated that an Army officer was passing through Gerald Griffin street about 10.30 p.m. when shots rang out, and the allegation is that he was fired at. The officer, drawing a revolver, replied to the firing. Two girls and a man were wounded.

The other girl, Miss Kathleen Deasy, Spangle Hill, was wounded in the throat. The man received only a superficial wound in the leg, and was not detained.
