Again, from the public point of view, the erection of gas lamps would be a great facility to vehicular and pedestrian traffic. All things considered, we feel as urged the No 1 District Council, if the matter is brought before that body, will favourably consider the matter, and it is to be hoped that arrangements may follow with the Corporation to supply light, where, as already stated, it is so much required.
