evenings that have now set in, and it has been suggested by many people that attention should again be called to the subject. It will be recalled that some years ago the question was vigorously taken up, and the need of having some gas lamps placed along this thorough are was made quite evident, but at that time the project did not materialise. It is to be hoped, however, now that the subject is renewed, the authorities concerned will take steps to provide these lights for the convenience not alone of the residents of a populous locality, but for the convenience of the public generally who use the Ballinacurra road. The residents are heavy retepayers, and in the sireumstances the supplying of a long felt want will, we think, be considered reasonable. Again, from the public point of view, the ercefion of gas lamps would be a great facility to vehicular and pedestrian traffic. All things considered, we feel as used the No I District Council, if the matter is brought before that body will favourably consider the matter, and it is to be hoped that arrangements may follow with the Corporation to supply light, where, as already stated, it is so match required.
