TROOPS AMBUSHED NEAR CASTLECONNELL.

A cycling party of National troops travelling between Castleconnell and Birdhill on the main road to Nenagh yesterday evening, was ambushed at Goig Hill, a couple of miles from Castleconnell. ed at evening Intense fire was poured up n the troops from a gations, and the sandpit, and the soldiers, having dismounted; took what available cover that offered.
