The new rate will be: loz., or under, \(\frac{1}{2}\)d.: 1 to 2023., 1d.

Every 20z. up to 2lb., 1d.

Printed paper" means a packet not exceeding 21b. containing books, pamphlets, aketches, photographs, maps, plans, and charts; and under certain conditions, commercial or business papers such as invoices, receipts, price lists, and quotations, deeds, agreements, circulars, Christmas cards, manuscript for Press and printed proofs, educational exercises and examination papers,
