THE SHOOTING OF LIEUT. HANRAHAN.

TWO ARRESTS.

National troops last night arrested "Eddy" Fitzgibbon and "Energy" O'Connor, two well-known Limerick irregulars, alleged to have been concerned in the shooting with fatal result of Lieut. Joseph Hanrahan, National Army, in the Roxborough Road, Limerick, on the 11th of the 17th October. At the inquest on the officer it was deposed to by three witnesses that five men were concerned with the shooting, and of these Fitzgibbon and O'Connor were identified. The arrests were effected in a house beyond Mount St Lawrence Cemetery.
