MUNICIPAL CONTESTS.

New Legislation Promised.

Mr Blythe (Minister for Local Government), replying to Mr H. Colohan in Dail Eireann last week, stated it was proposed to introduce legis- lation as soon as possible after the coming into operation of the Constitution to enable him to postpone the elections for Municipal Councils for a period not exceeding six months. He was aware that there was a feeling that the elections should be held in the summer months.

L.G.B. SEALED ORDER UNCHALLENGABLE.

Quoting the decision of the Court of Appeal for Southern Ireland, in the case of the Limerick Corporation against Comerton and others, in which it was held that the impugned orders of the L.G.B. allowing pensions to the officers of the Corporation were made within their jurisdiction, and could not be set aside on the ground that they were wrong in law or fact, Lord Justice Andrews dismissed the appeal by the Tyrone County Council from the order of the Belfast L.G.B. affirmed by Mr Justice Brown, allowing John Crawford, ex-rate collector, a pension, which the County Council refused, as Mr Crawford had not been a whole-time officer, they alleged.

CO. LIMERICK MAN'S DEATH IN CONSTANTINOPLE.

The death has occurred in Constantinople of Mr M J Fitzgerald (35), B.A., Irish Guards. He was a native of Kiltelly, and was for four years on the staff of the "Tipperary Star." At the outbreak of the Great War he joined the Irish Guards, and served four years on the Western front. He then went with the regiment to the Near East.
