Shooting of Lieut. Hanrahan.

At 11 o'clock yesterday morning, in the New Barracks, Limerick, the Military Court re-assembled for the tril of Gerard Fitzglbban and Joseph O'C mor, pivillans, Carey's-road, who are charged with sheoting and mortally wounding Lieutenant Jeseph Hanrahan, National Army, in the Roxborough road, Limerick, on the night of the 17 h October.

The trial was adjourned fr. m the 18th in tant for the production of a m l tary witness, who was not then available, being on duty in a remote part

of the command area. At the si ting of the Court yesterday morning. the Prosecutor said he had to apply for a further adj urrment. The military witness, whose evidence was material, had not arrived from Kerry, where he was at present on duty. His evidence was essential, inasmuch as he was alleged to have found the deceased officer's revolver after he was He asked for a reasonable adjournment of the enquiry to erable him to produce the soldier, and suggested that a date that would suit counsel for the defence be fixed.

At he opening of the City Desitor Court rester day, Mr Flood said in view of the fict that Courte had not been long in operation in Limeri k, and that the people were not yet quite aware that they would be held regularly, he would not take each a strict view of cases which were now to come befo e him as he would otherwise have d ne. There were some prosecut ocs under the Licersi g Laws, and his remarks would also apply to these. He pointed out that it was in the interest of lie need traders themselves that their business should be fairly and properly conducted, as there was a growing temperance movement in the country, and it wou'd be advisable that there should be as few complaints as possible in this regard. At present the Courts would have to be guided in dealing with their business by the exist. ing code of laws, but they looked forward to the date when they would be administering laws by their own people for the people of Ireland in an Irish Parliament, when they would be administered with no greater pleasure than by him and his colleagues.
