WORKER'S SUDDEN DEATH.

Mr J S McNeice, City Coroner, held an inquest
 on Saturday evening in Barrington's Hospital on
 the body of Lawrence Bratt, 48 years of age and
 married, who died suddenly on Friday night while
 at work in a city flour mill.

Sergeant O'Donnell represented the Civic
 Guard, and evidence of identification having been
 given, the medical evidence showed that deceased
 suffered from heart affection, which was the
 cause of death.

The jury returned a verdict in accordance with
 the medical testimony, and recommended the
 widow and children to the kind consideration of
 the employers of the deceased.

GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN IRELAND.
