**A BROOCH HINT.**

An experienced jeweller makes the assertion that few women know how to adjust their brooches. It is the general habit, he says, to grasp the brooch by the setting, consequently it soon needs repairing. The proper method is to take the body of the pin, not the top or setting, between the thumb and fingers and press it through the cloth, holding the setting only when clasping the pin. All jewellery must be very carefully handled, for the settings are easily bent, and a very slight displacement is sufficient to loosen the stones.

**USE CLOTHES BRUSH MORE.**

Use your clothes brush regularly and thoroughly. The average woman brushes her coat and skirt lightly—after she has put them on! What she should do is to brush them well when she takes them off, first shaking them to bring the dust to the surface of the cloth, then hanging them on a coat-hanger and applying the brush very thoroughly all over, but with particular attention to the seams inside as well as out. This treatment will keep them from having the threads cut by grit, and she will, at the same time, notice and small spot that needs removing with petrol.

**HINTS ON MENDING CUTLERY.**

Knives, forks, loose handles, &c., are often put aside simply because they have come apart, or loose, and are a source of risk to use. The following hints show how they can be mended.

1. Fill the hole in the handle with a mixture of powdered resin and fine silver sand. Then heat the knife or fork tang and press it firmly into the handle. Afterwards cool in water and clean off the surplus mixture that may have oozed out when pressing the tang home.
2. Use powdered alum and silver sand in equal proportions. Melt this mixture on the fire or over a gas flame in an old iron spoon, pour it into the hole in the handle, and quickly put the tang into the handle. Cutlery mended by this method should be allowed to cool gradually.
3. Make a mixture of four parts of resin, one part of beeswax, and one part of plaster of Paris. Put the mixture in the hole in the handle, heat the tang, and press it into the handle.

A Berlin Reuter message states that the Halle police have arrested five men in connection with the recent dynamite outrages directed against public monuments. According to the "Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung," they are all young workmen.

Bonds to the value of £50,000 have been stolen while they were in transit from London to Buenos Ayres, via Paris. The bonds were in registered packages, and in some way must have been removed from the mail bags.

An exact copy of the famous caravel, Santa Maria, in which Columbus discovered America, is now completed, and it is understood, says a Reuter Madrid message, that it will shortly be sent to London, the Spanish Government having presented it to the British Government for exhibition purposes.

**FLOUR MILLING WAGES CRUX.**

Workers in the Irish Flour Milling industry met on Sunday in Liberty Hall, Dublin, to consider the position created by the employers' determination to enforce the wages cut. The meeting, says the "Independent," approved the attitude of their representatives in the negotiations. The minimum wages in Dublin are 87s, and in the provinces 40s to 52s. The employers proposed a reduction of 18s, which they afterwards modified to 16s. At the conference the men's representatives offered to submit to a reduction of 8s in three cuts. No agreement was reached, but work will be continued this week.
