FUNERAL OF RIGHT REV. MONSIGNOR COFFEY,

The funeral of the Right Rev. Monsignor Coffey, Dunsied, New Zealand, whose death occurred in St. John's Hospital on Wednesday, took place yesterday in St. Michael's Catholic Church, where the remains were transferred on Thursday evening. The coffin rested on a catafalque in front of the High Altar, and at 11 o'clock solemn Office and Requiem High Mass was sung for the repose of the soul of the deceased ecclesiastic in presence of a large congregation. His Grace the Most Rev. Dr. Harty, Archbishop of Cashel and Emly, presided, the other prelates present being—the Most Rev. Dr. Hallinan, Bishop of Limerick, and the Most Rev. Dr. Fogarty, Bishop of Killaloe.

The celebrant of the Mass was the Rev Fr O'Sullivan, O.C. St. Mary's, who served for some years on the Australian mission with the late Monsignor Coffey; deacon, Rev Fr Connolly, Adm. the Cathedral; sub-deacon, Rev Fr O'Ryau, O.C. Cashel; master of ceremonies, Rev Fr MacN-mara, O.C. the Cathedral.

The chanters were Rev Fr Thornhill, O.C. St. Michael's, and Rev Fr Kelly, O.C. the Cathedral.
