THE MEATH HOSPITAL £20,000 SWEEP.

Pending the passage of the legislation now
 before the Dail Eireann empowering the holding of

 it has been necessary to conduct the draw for the

 Switzerland, where it will be held under the
 sanction of the Federal State. The draw will
 take place on Saturday, 2nd June, at 2 o'clock, in
 the Government Building, Atdorf, under the

 Alderman Alfred Byrne, T D; James Talbot, Esq,
 Solicitor to the Right Hon the Lord Mayor of

 ents. The first prize is £10,000. This is the third great
