THE MEATH HOSPITAL £20,000 SWEEP.

Pending the passage of the legislation now before Dail Eireann empowering the holding of Sweeps in Ireland in aid of Charitable Hospital, it has been necessary to conduct the draw for the Dail in Meath Hospital £20,000 Sweep at Aitdorf, Switzerland, where it will be held under the sanction of the Federal State. The draw will take place on Saturday, 2nd June, at 2 o'clock, in the Government Building, Aitdorf, under the supervision of the acting Lord Mayor of Dublin, Alderman Alfred Byrne, T.D.; James Talon, Esq., Solicitor to the Right Hon. the Lord Mayor of Dublin; the President of the Kantonal Government, the Chief of the Kantonal Police, and representatives of the British and Irish Press. The first prize is £1000. This is the third great Dublin Hospital Sweep organised by the well-known Dublin sportsman, Mr R. J. Duggan, and under these sweeps £30,000 has been divided between the Mater Hospital, Holles Street Cancer Hospital, and the Meath Hospital, while £40,000 will have been distributed amongst the luck prize winners in these three great Hospital Sweeps.
