

DEATH OF MR M O'DONNELL.

We announce with regret the demise of Mr Michael O'Donnell, of Mulgrave-street. The deceased had been in the service of the District Mental Hospital as foreman carpenter for the past 40 years, and was a prominent figure in Trades Union circles in the city, being President of the Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners, and a member of the Trade Council and the Plotholders' Union. His demise is very much regretted by many friends and relations.

The funeral, which took place from St John's Cathedral to Mount St Laurence Cemetery on Thursday, was very largely attended by the members of the Carpenters' Society, the Ancient Order of Foresters, and the Trades Council and other local bodies, and the staff of the Mental Hospital, including Dr Irwin, Dr Moloney, and Mr O'Shaughnessy. Wreaths were sent by his family and the local branch of the Plotholders' Union.
