## CITY EXPLOSION.

#### Boy Seriously Injured.

While sitting at the fireside in his home at Carryowen on Saturday night, a young fellow named John Hanlon sustained serious spuries by an explosion from the fire, the sauce of which is unknown. At the time Hanlon was reading a book, and the centents of the grate were blown in his direction. He sustained a compound fracture of the right leg, extensive injuries to the left leg and thigh, as well as to the head and face. He was remeved to Barrington's Hospital, where he less in a critical condition.

#### Fatal Termination.

The injered youth, who was only eighteen years of age, died early this meroing in Barrington's Hospital. From the outset the Besident Surgeon of the Hospital entertained no hopes of the recevery, as his injuries were serious and extensive. So far no light has been thrown on the cause of the explosion, but this will probably be explained at the inquest to be held. The deceased was son of Mr G Hanlom, for whom great sympathy is telt in his bereavement.
