At the inquest on Sergeant Woods, Civic Guards, the jury, by twelve to six, returned a verdict of wilful murder against a person or persons unknown.

## ROBBERIES IN MILTOWN-MALBAY DISTRICT.

A gang of thieves and house-breakers are still at large in Miltown-Malbay district, and carry out their acts of plunder and destruction with impunity (a correspondent wires).

On Tuesday night, some furnished lodges used as summer resorts were broken into at Spanish Point, including those of Lord Inchiquin, Dro-moland, Castle, and Mr Croker, Black-water, Limerick.

The thieves carefully ransacked all the rooms and apparently took their time, as the floors were strewn with cigarette ends. They took with them all the keys found in the lodges.
