

is stated to be due to the reconstitution of the Cabinet, a reason which is also given as a temporary holding up of the ratification of the 1918 Russian Treaty.

Comments on the MacDonald-Poincaré agreement are on the whole favourable, and a very favourable impression has, it is stated, been made in France by the British Premier's action. The need for a conference between the two Governments is generally recognised, but Mr MacDonald's preoccupation with home problems, the fact that the Palatinat question has not yet been cleared up, will, it is expected, delay an event for some time.

The British Cabinet met yesterday and had a long discussion on European and general problems, as well as a debate on home affairs. Two further meetings of the Cabinet, it is announced, will be held during the week.

BUSY BRITISH CABINET.

Many Problems Discussed.

London, Monday—The following official communique was issued to-night:—The Cabinet met this afternoon at 10 Downing Street at 3 o'clock, and continued until 5.30.

Reports were received from the Committees on Unemployment, Housing, and Agriculture, which state that considerable progress has been made in working out the details of the Government's programme. In addition various questions of Foreign Affairs, and Colonial interest were discussed.

The view of the number of urgent problems requiring immediate consideration, the Cabinet has arranged to hold two further meetings this week.

PAY OF RATE COLLECTORS.

In reply to Deputy Nagle, the Minister for Local Government stated in the Dail last week that to be eligible for a pension a rate collector should have devoted his whole time to the duty. It has been an existing officer within the meaning of the Local Government Act, 1898.
