We regret to record the death of the Very Rev Capon O'Shaughnessy. P.P. Knookaderry, which occurred at the Parochial House on Tuesday at the advanced age of 83 years. Early in his ministerial career the rev. gentleman was a pro-fessor in St. Munchin's College, and afterwards Curate of 8t Michael's. He was for the lengthy. period of 34 years Parish Priest of Knockaderry, and was very highly respected and esteemed by all classes and creeds.
