### THE ELEPHANT'S FEET.

At twice round an elephant's foot equals eight seems almost incredible, yet a little reflection will show you that it is not so wonderful as it appears to be, says a contemporary. Things are large or small comparatively, and if we could see the foot of an elephant by itself it would present a far different appearance as to size from what it is when overshadowed by the mountain of its supports. The elephants in the Indian commissariat being dieted according to height are to be measured annually to determine the amount of food to which they are entitled. To present this is done by means of the ordinary standard with crossbar on top, but formerly it was done by placing a rope round the animal's fore foot close to the ground, and multiplying the length so obtained by two. This measurement generally gives a quarter of an inch or so more, but never less, than the actual height.

### WORLD'S DEEPEST WELL.

The deepest well in the world was recently drilled near Fairmont, West Virginia. When drilling stopped on June 18th, 1919, a depth of 792ft. had been reached, exceeding by 193ft. the depth of the previous "deepest well in the world," which is also in West Virginia. The well was sunk in search of oil or natural gas, but yielded neither.
