FUNERAL OF MR C. H. POWER

The remains of the late Mr Charles H. Power were interred yesterday morning in Mount St. Laurence Cemetery amid general expressions of regret and sorrow. On Saturday night the remains reached Limerick at nine o'clock from Dublin, and were taken to St. Michael's Catholic Church. Yesterday morning, at 8 30, Requiem Mass was celebrated for the soul of deceased; and at 11 o'clock the funeral left for the last resting place. The cortege was of large dimensions, being representative of the business and professional community as well as public bodies and labour interests. During the progress of the funeral through the streets the people showed their respect for the deceased young gentleman by drawn blinds. Those in the Chamber of Cammeros and P.Y.M.A. were also drawn. It was a very striking tribute to the memory of the late lamented deceased, and fully expressive of the sympathy felt

for his parents and family in their great loss.
