### DEATH OF VERY REV DEAN BOURCHIER.

We regret to record the death, which took place on Tuesday, at West Wing, Kilballyowen, Bruff, of the Very Rev. William Chadwick Bourchier, M.A., Dean of Cashel.

Son of the late Mr John Bourchier, J.P., of Baggotstown House, Bruff, Dean Bourchier had a distinguished collegiate and coalesiactical earcer. He was educated at Portora Royal 'chool, Encikillen, and at Trinity College, Dublin, where he was a Scholar and Junior Moderator in Classic. In 1889, he married the daughter of Mr Cathoart Thompson, J.P., Nova Scotia, and grand-daughter of the Hor. Joseph Howe, Liertenan'-Governor of Nova Scotia. He served for many years as Chaplain of the Royal Navy other appointments included a domestic chaplaincy to the Marquis, Camden at Bayham Abbey in 1879.

Since 1916 he has been Dean of Cashel. In his native Co. Limerick the news of his death has been received with much regret by the clergy and laity.
