## VACCINATION QUESTION.

Statement by Mr MacNeill.

### Views of Rural Districts.

In the Dail, Mr MacNeill, Minister, supplemented the statement he had made on the educational measures before the House. He outlined the Government's policy and said in rural districts in the future would be to give a definitely rural bent, both in primary and secondary education. The aim would be to direct attention to carrying out the programme of the people, and towards the social and economic life of the country.

### MENTAL CASES IN CLARE.

In an annual report to the Committee of the Clare Mental Hospital, Dr F. S. states that the total number of admissions during the year was 562. There were 15 first admission cases, and 15 re-admissions. Nineteen males had been discharged cured, and 25 females. Of the cases treated, 19 had been assigned as a cause in the preceding year. In 13 cases, stress has been assigned as a cause, two cases of intemperance in drink, and 13 remaining in the institution was 13 at the beginning of the year. The gross receipts for the year was £28,161 14s 3d.

## VACCINATION DEFAULTERS.

At Rathkeale District Council, arising out of a report on the number of vaccination defaulters in the rural district, it was announced that there had been a letter received from the Department for Local Government and Public Health drawing attention to the fact that nearly fifty vaccination defaulters had been noted in a recent return, and that this fact showed that the Vaccination Acts were not being effectively administered in the district.

It was decided that a copy of the communication from the Department be sent to the medical officers concerned.

A further communication from the Department of Local Government and Public Health urged that the Council should take energetic action to ensure compliance with the Vaccination Acts.

## FISHING AND KELP INDUSTRIES IN WEST CLARE.

The fishermen along the Clare Western seaboard, realising the critical position of their fishing and kelp industries, have decided to establish a fishermen's association, and their organiser is Mr M J Keane, National teacher, of Corbally, Kilkee. Starting his organising campaign in Kilkee, he successfully established the first branch of the association, of which the fishermen operating in the district were enrolled members.

Very Rev M Breen, P.P., Kilkee, presided at the meeting. Mr Keane has also established branches at Lisconnor, Quilty, and Doolin.

## DROWNING ACCIDENT NEAR ABBEYFEALE.

Following a violent thunderstorm on Saturday evening, the River Oonlagh, a branch of the Feale, became flooded, and a young man named Michael Roche, of Ballybehy, Abbeyfeale, aged 16, lost his life while attempting to cross it on horse back. The body was recovered at Knocknashaun, about a mile down the river. Great sympathy is felt for the mother and family of the deceased.
