DEATH OF REV MICHAEL MURPHY, P.P.

We regret to announce the death of Rev. M. Murphy, P.P., St Patrick's, which occurred at St John's Hospital to-day. The rev gentleman had been ailing for some time past. He was a native of Dromcollogher, Co. Limerick, and was 60 years of age. He was educated at the old Diocesan Seminary, Limerick, and completed his studies at the Irish College, Paris. He was 25 years connected with St John's Parish, for a period of which he was Administrator, and later on became P.P. of St Patrick's. He was very highly respected and esteemed in city and county, and was a valued member of the Limerick Mental Hospital Committee.
Requiem High Mass will be celebrated at 11 o'clock on Monday in St John's Cathedral, and the funeral will take place at 1 o'clock to Mount St Lawrence Cemetery.
