**SCHOOL GARDENING.**

Articulture is a very attractive subject, and in the development of the child-mind in country life—its pleasures and occupations—garden-making is an important part, and, doubtless, will be more so in the future. Because of the new educational programme in the Irish State will, as indicated recently by the Minister, be more in accordance with rural life, and accordingly we may presume that encouragement will be given in connection therewith for the furtherance of school garden-making, and the love of a pursuit which is at once practical, healthy, and interesting. Under the scheme of the Limerick Endowment for Technical Education important work has for the past been done in the County Limerick. As we see from a report which appeared in the Press, the National Schools are giving instruction in school garden-making with very gratifying results, as is shown by recent examinations and the awards of prizes by the Trustees so conclusively proved. The school gardens were successful, doubtless next year the same will be the case.

**OBSEQUIES OF THE REV. M. MURPHY, P.P.**

The obsequies of the late Rev Michael Murphy, P.P., St Patrick's, took place yesterday afternoon in the solemn Office and Requiem High Mass in St John's Cathedral at 11 o'clock. Overnight the remains were deposited on a catafalque in front of the High Alter, and the interment took place in Mount St Lawrence Cemetery at the conclusion of the solemn ceremony. The Bishop of Waterford and Lismore, Most Rev Dr Hackett, presided at the Mass, which was celebrated by Rev W Murphy, C.C., Rathkeale (brother of the deceased pastor); deacon, Rev Fr Kelly, C.C., St John's; sub-deacon, Rev Fr Carroll, C.C., St Mary's, and master of ceremonies, Rev Fr Carroll, C.C., St John's.
