Many Passengers Injured.

Two White Star liners were caught hurricane in the Atlantic while making for New York last Tuesday night. The Homeric, a 34,350 ton boat, managed to outweather this storm with the loss of a lifeboat, but the Arabio, which is. only half the size and 14 years older—having been built in 1908, with a tonnage of 16.786—suffered more severely.

The seas smashed to atoms the great plate glass window of the dining saloon, broke the windows of the first-class cabins and finoded the companion -Twenty-four persons-mostely womenwere injured, and eight ambulances were cent to the pler to meet the Arabic when she docked.

The Arabic sailed from Hamburg on August 16 and called at Southampton and Cherbourg on 18 h August. She arrived at Halifax on the 25th, and left for New York.
