Labourer Shot Dead.

News reached Limerick this evening that a man named Edward Walsh, a labourer, was shot dead at Fedamore last night. Details of the shocking occurrence are lacking, but it appears that at midnight Walsh was in his house, when he was fired at and mortally wounded.

No motive so far has been assigned for the crime, but the Civic Guard at Oroom are looking for a man whose description has been sent out to the various stations. This evening Superintendent McGuire, Limerick, visited the scene of the tragedy. The victim was a married man with a family.
